PSAC Football - Week Eight Notes - 10/14/09

Quick Hits

- Two PSAC games are slated for television this week. The PA SportsFever Network will kick things off by televising the Mercyhurst at Clarion game at 1:00 p.m. FSN-Pittsburgh then televises the Edinboro at California game at 3:00 p.m.

- Cheyney QB Angel Rodriguez ran for a PSAC season-high 207 yards last week. Although the last QB in the PSAC to run for over 200 yards in a game is currently unavailable, Rodriguez is believed to be the first PSAC QB in this decade to run for over 200 yards in a game.

- Bloomsburg is one of just four teams in the country that is allowing fewer than 11 points per game on average. The Huskies are second in the country in scoring defense at 10.43 points allowed per game.

- Bloomsburg (1-of-16) and East Stroudsburg (1-of-7) are two of only nine teams in the country that have allowed one or fewer fourth down conversions on defense this year.

- Shippensburg WR Mike Harris is one of just 10 WRs in the country that is currently averaging over 100 yards per game in receiving. Harris also ranks sixth in the country in total receiving yards.

- Three PSAC punters - Kyler Ford of Shippensburg (4th), Kyle Witman of Slippery Rock (19th) and Matt Dineen of Kutztown (20th) - rank in the top 20 in the country in average yards per punt.

- The PSAC has two of the top five kickoff returners in the country in terms of average return in Akwasi Owusu-Ansah of IUP (4th - 33.25 ypr) and Alfonso Hoggard of Clarion (5th - 32.0 ypr).

- With West Chester's loss to East Stroudsburg two weeks ago breaking the Golden Rams' 18-game PSAC East winning streak that dated back to 2006, the two longest winning streaks in divisional play will both be put on the line this week when Edinboro visits California. The Vulcans have a 17-game PSAC West winning streak while the Fighting Scots have a five-game PSAC West winning streak.

- That aforementioned West Chester loss to East Stroudsburg marked the Golden Rams' first loss to a PSAC East other than Bloomsburg in six years, since the 2003 season. That loss was also to the Warriors. The Golden Rams had won 33 straight PSAC East games against opponents other than Bloomsburg up until then.

- Kutztown kicker Matt Dineen kicked five field goals in the Golden Bears' win over Cheyney in Week 6. He is the first kicker since East Stroudsburg's Greg Knauss in 2007 to make five FGs in a game.

- Bloomsburg has won 30 straight PSAC East games against opponents other than West Chester. The Huskies' last loss to a PSAC East opponent other than West Chester was to East Stroudsburg, a 30-24 loss in Week 5 of the 2004 season.

- Bloomsburg K Jon Koenig is one of just eight kickers in the country that have made a field goal from 50 yards or beyond this year.

- Four different PSAC players have recorded three sacks in a game so far this year through seven games: Josh Simmons and Andy Horn of Shippensburg, Justin Presley of Bloomsburg and Fred Hale of Mercyhurst. Only two players recorded at least three sacks in a game all of last year: Jon Ochs of Bloomsburg and Mike Perillo of Edinboro.

- Three PSAC teams - West Chester, California and C.W. Post - scored 50 or more points in Week 4 wins on September 19. That did not happen last year and it marked the first time since Week 2 of the 2007 season (Sept. 7-8) that three different PSAC teams scored 50 or more in the same week. In that week in 2007, East Stroudsburg, Edinboro and IUP each scored 50 or more.

PSAC With Three Teams Ranked

Both PSAC teams that were in both polls last week remained in both polls this week and one more entered one of the polls, leaving the PSAC with two teams ranked in the AFCA poll and three in the D2football.com poll. The PSAC started the year with four teams in the AFCA and five in the D2football.com poll.

Bloomsburg, the only undefeated team left in the PSAC, moved up one spot to No. 4 in both the AFCA and D2football.com polls. Edinboro moved up one spot to No. 12 in the AFCA poll and four spots to No. 15 in the D2football.com poll. For the first time since the Week 2 poll, California is ranked in the D2football.com poll, re-entering the poll this week at No. 23 while the Vulcans continue to receive votes in the NFCA poll for the sixth straight week. Shippensburg is also receiving votes in the AFCA poll for the second time this year.

This marks the sixth week this season that the PSAC has not had the most teams of any conference represented in both Top 25 polls, although the PSAC now has the second-most teams of any conference in the D2football.com poll behind only the four teams from both the MIAA and GLIAC. The PSAC had the most schools of any conference or tied for the most schools of any conference in both polls for all of last season and for the first two weeks of this season.

PSAC Players of the Week - Oct. 11 (Week 7)

PSAC East Offensive Player of the Week Joe Wright, West Chester

QB, Sr., Wilmington, Del./St. Mark's

Wright accounted for all five of West Chester's touchdowns in a 34-26 win over C.W. Post. He completed 16-of-25 passes (64 percent) for 252 yards and four touchdowns and he also ran for a score. His two-yard TD run with 13 seconds left in the third quarter gave WCU a 21-20 lead. Then, with the Golden Rams trailing 26-21 early in the fourth quarter, he hit Dan DePalma for a 52-yard TD pass to put the Rams up for good and then six minutes later, engineered a 10-play, 51-yard drive that was capped by a 17-yard TD pass to Steve Miller that put the game away. Wright also threw two TD passes in the first half, one to DePalma and one to Miller, that put the Rams up at halftime after trailing 12-0.

PSAC East Defensive Player of the Week Vinnie Ranaut, Shippensburg

LB, So., Bear, Del./Caravel Academy

Ranaut made nine tackles, including eight solo stops in Shippensburg's 26-22 win over Kutztown. Of his nine tackles, 2.5 were for a loss and one of those was a sack. He also recorded an interception and returned it four yards. The pick came in the first quarter with the score tied 7-7 and it stopped a Kutztown drive in Shippensburg territory. Ranaut is the second different Shippensburg player to earn the PSAC East Defensive Player of the Week award this season.

PSAC West Offensive Player of the Week Alfonso Hoggard, Clarion

RB/KR, Jr., Philadelphia, Pa./Caravel Academy

Hoggard earns the PSAC West Offensive Player of the Week honor for the second straight week after running for 205 yards and two touchdowns to help Clarion to an upset win over Slippery Rock, 27-10. Hoggard picked up his 205 yards on 33 carries (6.2 ypc) and his TD runs were from 19 and 84 yards out. The 84-yard TD run in the third quarter was a Clarion record and it gave Clarion a two-TD lead at 24-10. His 205 rushing yards are also tied for the eighth-best single-game performance in school history and he is the first Clarion back to go over 200 yards in a game since 2002. Hoggard finished the contest with 225 all-purpose yards, as he also returned a pair of punts for 20 yards.

PSAC West Defensive Player of the Week Greg Sondag, Edinboro

LB, Jr., Wadsworth, Ohio/Pickerington Central

Sondag keyed the Edinboro defensive effort that held IUP to just 189 yards of total offense in the Fighting Scots' 38-24 win over the Crimson Hawks. Sondag recorded 10 tackles, eight of which were solo stops, and 3.5 of which were tackles for loss. One of those TFLs was a sack and he also had a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. His sack and forced fumble of the IUP quarterback came a key point in the game, as the fumble was returned 30 yards to the IUP 5-yardline and Edinboro would score on the next play to go up 31-10.

National Leaders

The PSAC has one individual and one team that are leading or co-leading the country in various categories as of the latest NCAA statistical report. They are listed below.

- West Chester punt returner Kevin Garland leads the country in average punt return at 26.9 yards per return. He leads the player in second place by 6.9 ypr.

- Clarion continues to lead the country alone in fewest tackles for loss allowed per game. The Golden Eagles have been stopped for a loss just 21 times this year for an average of just 3.0 times per game.

PSAC in Non-Conference Action

The PSAC went 9-5 this year against Division II non-conference competition, and 9-6 overall. This is a large improvement over last year's 6-9 overall non-conference record (6-8 vs. Division II opponents). Long Ones are Rare

Bloomsburg K Jon Koenig booted a career-long 50-yard field goal on September 19 in the Huskies' win over Kutztown. It marked the third straight year that a PSAC kicker made a field goal from at least 50 yards but it also marked only the fifth FG made from 50+ yards in the PSAC in the last nine seasons dating back to 2000. Koenig and Millersville's John Banzhof are the only active PSAC kickers that have made FGs from 50 yards or more. Listed below are the PSAC kickers that have made FGs from 50+ yards in this decade.

Ranked Scots Equals No Good

Edinboro was upset at home by Shippensburg in Week 2. The Red Raiders were unranked, while the Fighting Scots were ranked 15th and 16th in the two polls. The loss by Edinboro marked the first time since last year that a ranked PSAC team lost to an unranked PSAC team. That last time it happened was also the

only time it happened last year, when the Fighting Scots lost at home to Mercyhurst. Prior to last year, Edinboro came out on top in the previous time it happened, as an unranked Fighting Scots squad topped ranked Bloomsburg in 2007.

Streaks

There are a couple of streaks that are currently active, some of which teams want to keep going, and others that teams want to break. California has a 17-game winning streak in PSAC West play.

On the opposite end, Cheyney is looking to break a current 20-game losing streak in PSAC East play and a 24-game losing streak overall. Lock Haven is looking to break a 11-game losing streak in PSAC West play and a 17-game losing streak overall.

Bloomsburg Huskies

The Huskies are 7-0 for the third time this decade and the seventh time in school history...Bloomsburg is 15-2 in its last 17 road games...K Jon Koenig kicked two field goals in the Huskies win over East Stroudsburg including one of 49-yards. That is just one yard shy of his school record tying 50-yarder set earlier this season. He now has 27 field goals for his career, just two shy of the school record...TE Ben Weaber caught a career-high six passes in the win over East Stroudsburg...BU's defense held an opponent to less than 100 yards rushing for the fourth time this season...With 165 yards rushing against ESU, Derrick Price moved into 10th place on the Huskies' all-time career rushing list with 1,785 yards.

California Vulcans

Cal U has won 17-consecutive games against PSAC West opponents...The Vulcans' defense didn't allow Lock Haven past midfield in the first half...WR A.J. Jackson has scored at least one touchdown in six-straight games...QB Josh Portis has thrown 18 touchdown passes over the last 19 quarters...Head coach John Luckhardt has 199 career wins...In its five-straight wins, Cal U has averaged an impressive 41.2 points/game after scoring only a combined 27 points in the first two games of the season...The Vulcans are off to a 4-0 start in divisional play for the fourth-straight year, winning the PSAC West title each of the previous times...Cal U returns to Adamson Stadium for Homecoming against Edinboro...The Vulcans have won their last four Homecoming games, including a 26-8 victory over the Fighting Scots in 2007.



Cheyney Wolves

Cheyney scored a season high 36 points in a 47-36 defeat. It was the most points Cheyney has scored since 2003...Fr. QB Angel Rodriguez had a career day. He rushed for 207 yards (21 carries) and threw for 188 (11-15). He ran for four touchdowns (42, 60, 16, 76 yards) and threw for one (67 yards)...The Wolves recorded 640 all-purpose yards, more than 180 yards than any other game this season...Fr. K Tyler Wilkinson is now 10-11 on PATs. He is 7-7 over the past two games...This was the only time this season that the Wolves rushing defense surrendered less than 200 yards...However the passing defense surrendered a season high 225 yards...Cheyney turned the ball over four times via the fumble.

Clarion Golden Eagles

Clarion topped the Region's #4 team, Slippery Rock, at SRU by a 27-10 final...RB/All-Purpose Back Alfonso Hoggard rushed for 205 yards and 2 TDs, including a Clarion record 84-yd TD run in the third quarter to give Clarion a 24-10 lead...He also had a 19-yard td in the second quarter...His 205 yards were the eighth best single-game performance at Clarion...Fr. DB Daily Whitten had 2 interceptions, including a third quarter pick and return for 41 yards and the go-ahead score (17-10)...Jacques Robinson has 46 catches, 495 yards and 3 TDs in 2009 and 139 career catches and 1,575 receiving yards...QB Tyler Huether has completed 424 of 835 career passes for 5,104 yards and 27 TDs...He ranks 2nd in attempts, completions and passing yards...He passed Pat Carbol (5,097; 1982-85)...Clarion hosts Mercyhurst on Saturday at 1pm...The game will broadcast live on Sportsfever TV.



C.W. Post Pioneers

C.W. Post could not hold off a late charge from West Chester as the Golden Rams scored 13 points in the fourth quarter for the win...Jr. QB Eric Anderwkavich finished the game with 13 completions on 21 pass attempts for 152 yards and three touchdowns...Jr. WR Darnal Williams finished the game with five catches for 65 yards while Fr. RB Thomas Beverly added 71 yards on the ground for the Pioneers...The Pioneers totaled 315 yards on 58 plays and were 3-for-3 in red-zone chances...Anderwkavich is ranked fifth in the PSAC in total offensive yards, averaging 231.9 yards a game...Beverly is third in rushing with an average 91.0 yards a game...C.W. Post is back on the road next week against

Millersville...The Pioneers scored a season-high 55 points against the Marauders last season.

East Stroudsburg Warriors

No. 5 Bloomsburg used a 98-yard TD drive in the fourth quarter to beat the Warriors, 27-13, on Homecoming weekend...ESU was unable to overcome a double-figure deficit for the second straight week, falling behind 20-6 early in the third quarter...Sr. WR Sam Shuman caught a 27-yard TD pass and also handled the punting for the first time in his career...He rolled a 50-yarder to the 2-yard line before the Huskies' game-clinching drive...Sr. FS Nicholas Artinger picked off two passes and has five interceptions this season...The Warriors forced three turnovers and have 16 through seven games...Fr. TB Kendrick Williams had 49 rushing yards and 57 receiving yards in his first career start...Jr. K Drew Reinhard made a career-long 40-yard field goal...The Warriors are at Kutztown next week.



Edinboro Fighting Scots

Edinboro picked up its second straight win over IUP as the offense piled up 452 yards and the defense held the Crimson Hawks to 189 yards...Trevor Harris moved into second place in PSAC career total offense with 11,068 yards after accounting for 331 yards. He threw three TD passes and is now tied for fourth in PSAC career TD passes. Harris has thrown a touchdown in 32 straight games...His had an interception, which snapped a string of 102 passes without a pickoff...Edinboro's five-game winning streak matches the longest since Scott Browning took over as head coach four years ago, and the 4-0 PSAC West record is the best start since 1995...Fr. Marcus Johnson's 20-yard TD reception was the first of his career...Greg Sondag paced a strong defensive effort with 10 tackles, including four for losses, a fumble caused and a fumble recovery...David Bostic had career-highs of 31 carries and 116 yards.



Gannon Golden Knights

Gannon dropped its fourth straight game with a 27-17 loss at Mercyhurst...The Lakers held senior tailback Jon Richardson without a touchdown for the first time this season...Jr. WR Geoff Hicks set career-highs in receptions (7), receiving yards (85) and receiving touchdowns (2)...Jr. QB Bob Bartley rallied the Golden Knights from a 21-point deficit by throwing for 217 yards and two touchdowns in the second half...Jr. Tyler Batts returned a kickoff 82 yards in the third quarter, marking the third-longest kickoff return in school history. Sr. Anthony Weaver recorded his first career interception on Mercyhurst's first drive of the game...Gannon has lost four consecutive games for the first time since 2007...The Golden Knights passed for over 200 yards in back-to-back games for the first time since week three and four of last season.



IUP Crimson Hawks

IUP saw its losing streak reach four with a 38-24 loss to Edinboro...The Crimson Hawks will finish with a losing record in the PSAC West for the first time since 1981...Akwas Owusu-Ansah almost rallied IUP from a 21-point fourth quarter deficit with a 78-yard kickoff return and 70-yard punt return for touchdowns...He now has eight touchdowns in his career, including three kickoff returns, three punt returns, one interception return and one fumble return...Tobias Robinson rushed for 79 yards and moved into 11th place in IUP history with 1,964 yards...Craig Burgess broke a school record when he made his 11th consecutive field goal, a 41-yarder in the second quarter that tied the game at 10...His streak came to an end when he missed a 34-yarder in the third quarter...Burgess did extend his consecutive extra point streak to 77...QB Andrew Krewatch missed his second straight game with a shoulder injury.



Kutztown Golden Bears

Dontay Wilson became the 10th running back in Kutztown history to top 2,000 career yards. He is the first KU running back since Stephen Gammage in 2004 to reach the 2,000-yard milestone. Wilson has 2,033 career yards...Kutztown



had two running plays of 60 or more yards against Shippensburg: 63-yard run by QB Kevin Morton and a 60-yard run by Wilson in which he went over the 2,000-yard plateau...Kevin Bolinsky had two sacks, his second multi-sack game of the season...Dominick Massey caught his first career touchdown pass against Shippensburg...After holding Shippensburg to 82 rushing yards, Kutztown has held four teams below 100 yards rushing this year...Morton completed seven passes to seven different receivers...Jake Cahill converted Kutztown's first two-point conversion of the 2009 season following Massey's touchdown catch with 3:35 remaining...KU did return a blocked PAT for a score against Clarion, but this was the Golden Bears' first conventional conversion of the season.



Slippery Rock - The Rock

Thursday night's loss to Clarion snapped a five-game Rock win streak in the series and was the first in four games pitting "the teacher" Rock head coach George Mihalik against "the student," former SRU defensive coordinator/current Clarion head coach Jay Foster...Mihalik is now 17-5 all-time against Clarion...The Rock entered Thursday's game ranked fourth in the first NCAA Division II Super Region 1 ranking of the season... Jr. K C.J. Bahr extended his string of successful extra point kicks to 62 with one against Clarion...With four points against Clarion, Bahr moved into ninth place on SRU's career scoring list with 174 points in three seasons...He also moved into third place on the career extra points list with 102 and into a tie for third on the career field goals list with 24...So. H-Back Devin Goda had a career night with seven receptions for 105 yards vs. Clarion.



Lock Haven Bald Eagles

Lock Haven dropped its 17th straight game after the Bald Eagles fell to perennial PSAC West power California 48-14...The 14 points was a season high...Lock Haven is one loss away from tying the all-time school record for consecutive losses, which is 18 from 1925-27...The Bald Eagles continue to get solid play from the defense including Shane Barie, who has a team-high 33 tackles on the year. He led the way against Cal with a game-high seven tackles, six of which were solo stops...Lock Haven is back in action next weekend against IUP...The Bald Eagles haven't beaten IUP since 1981.

West Chester Golden Rams

West Chester downed C.W. Post, 34-26, Saturday, marking the Golden Rams' first win on Long Island in the series history...Sr. QB Joe Wright threw for a season-high four TDs and rushed for another score...He had a hand in all five of West Chester's TDs...Wright's four TD passes now gives him 40 career TD tosses...Jr. WR Dan DePalma caught five balls for 146 yards and two TDs...He has now caught for more than 100 yards in each of the Rams' last three games...Both DePalma and Steve Miller each caught two TDs Saturday...Mike Dell registered 10 tackles, including eight solo efforts. He also recorded a sack.



Mercyhurst Lakers

Mercyhurst downed rival Gannon 27-17 and retained the Niagara Cup for the fourth-straight time...RB Gerald Anderson was the Lakers go-to guy in the victory...He recorded career-highs with 175 yards on 25 carries and scored all three of Mercyhurst's offensive touchdowns...His yardage total was the highest since Lakers all-time leader Richard Stokes ran for 162 yards against Northern Michigan on Oct. 27, 2007...Mercyhurst also returned a fumble for a touchdown for the second consecutive year when Fred Hale caused a sack in the end zone and Ian Wild fell on the ball for the score, marking the first time since Adam Brown did so in the Lakers home opener against Clarion a year ago on Sept. 20, 2008...Mercyhurst held Gannon to 75 yards rushing, the lowest total this season...Sr. RB Ben Jennings moved into eighth-place all-time with 1,297 yards on 275 total carries.



Millersville Marauders

Millersville snapped a five-game skid and earned its first PSAC East victory of the season with a 47-36 win at Cheyney...Both of Millersville's wins this season have come on the road...It was Millersville's 26th straight win over Cheyney...Millersville has scored at least 30 points in 17 of the last 18 games against Cheyney...Bill Shirk threw three touchdown passes for the third time in his career and for the first time since Oct. 18, 2008...Jamal Smith tied a career high with seven catches and he caught two TD passes for the second time in the last three games...Lou Brown set a career high with 83 yards receiving and made his first TD reception...Millersville's 225 yards on the ground was its best total of the season and its 400 yards of total offense was the most in the last eight games...Millersville recorded four sacks for the first time since Nov. 3, 2007.



Shippensburg Red Raiders

Sr. Mark Rossi, who entered the season with just two career touchdown receptions, has totaled 12 receptions for 144 yards and seven touchdowns...Sr. Mike Harris totaled more than 100 receiving yards for the third time this season and the 11th time in his career, totaling nine receptions for 134 yards...With four games remaining in the regular season, Harris needs just eight receptions to tie the school record of Jamie Ware '99 for career pass catches. He also needs 746 receiving yards to tie Ware's record for career receiving yardage...Sr. Chad DiFebbo finished the afternoon completing 21-of-39 passes for 335 yards and three touchdowns without an interception...His performance ranks 10th in school history for a single game and is the most since Gabe Maiocco '08 threw for 369 yards in 2007 against Lock Haven...Head coach Rocky Rees, whose Raiders have now eclipsed their win totals of the 2007 and 2008 seasons, has compiled a career coaching record of 150-118-2 and a record at Ship of 114-103-1.

What to Expect

This game will serve as somewhat of an "elimination" game, with the winner remaining in contention for the PSAC West title while the loser will be two games behind the division leader with just two games to play.

The Golden Eagles are one of the hottest teams in the PSAC right now, having knocked off Slippery Rock last week, which was and still is ranked in the top six in the NCAA regional rankings. Clarion's passing game is still its strength with two of the top 10 receivers in the league in catches per game with Jacques Robinson and Matt Foradora but recently, the running game has gotten a boost behind Alfonso Hoggard, who has taken over the conference lead in average rushing ypg. He and the Eagles will have a stiff test against the Laker defense, which has carried the team this year, as it boasts the top pass defense and second-best scoring defense in the league. The Lakers have only allowed over 20 points in one out of seven games this year.

Mercyhurst's offense has done just enough for most of the year and last week, had one of its best performances of the year in scoring 27 points, their second-highest output of the season. The passing game, although it has produced at least one touchdown in the last six games, has produced under 100 yards in each of the last two weeks. QB Joe Laffey also has at least one interception in the last five games, which is bad news given that Clarion has returned three INTs for touchdowns this year, including two by Daily Whitten, despite having one of the worst pass defenses in the league. RB Gerald Anderson is coming off his best career game, having gone for 175 yards last week.

If the matchups on offense and defense even out as has been the case with both teams in some games this year, then the game could come down to special teams. Mercyhurst averages just 19.6 ypr on kickoffs while Hoggard averages 32.0 ypr for Clarion. As a team, the Lakers average 7.1 ypr on punts, led by Paris Brunner's 6.4 average but that is matched by Hoggard's 7.9 average and Clarion's 7.3. Laker K Robert Giambra is 5-for-7 on FGs and 14-for-17 on PATs while Clarion K Robert Mamula is 10-for-13 on FGs and 20-for-22 on PATs. One area the Lakers have an advantage in is on defending punt returns, as the Lakers have allowed just 1.3 ypr on punts while Clarion has allowed 4.5, although both teams are within .02 of a yard of each other on average net punt return.

What to Expect

C.W. Post is perhaps one of the most improved teams in the PSAC from the first game of the year to this point and the Pioneers will be matched up against a Millersville team that last week surpassed its win total from last year but is ranked among the worst in the league on defense.

The Pioneers have the league's top rushing offense behind RB Thomas Beverly and QB Eric Anderkwavich, who is the second-leading rusher in the PSAC among QBs. They also lead the league in average yards per attempt at 5.0, the only team in the league at that number. Post will likely run the ball frequently at the Marauders, who give up over 250 ypg on the ground and only once this year have held an opponent under 200 yards rushing. Post put up 55 points against the Marauders last year and twice this year has scored 40 or more, including against a decent defense in Shippensburg two weeks ago, so another breakout offensive performance is a possibility given Millersville gives up on average over 40 points.

The Marauders are coming off their best offensive performance of the year to this point last week with 47 points against Cheyney. However, that marked only the second time this year that Millersville scored more than 30 points. Post's strength on defense is against the pass while Millersville's offensive strength is also the pass with QB Bill Shirk getting the ball to leading receiver Jamal Smith, who ranks in the top 10 in the PSAC in both receptions and yards per game. One thing the Marauders have done well is not turn the ball over this year, as Shirk has thrown just five interceptions and the Marauders have a +6 turnover margin while by contrast, Post has generated just nine turnovers on defense, tied for third worst in the league and its -4 margin is also among the bottom of the league.

Millersville has an advantage over C.W. Post in the return game, as Lou Brown's leads a talented group of kick returners that combine for a 21.2 average on kick returns while Brown averages 8.0 ypr on punts while Post averages only 17.4 ypr on kicks and 5.7 on punts. However, Millersville has returned just eight punts this year, fourth fewest in the league, and the Marauders also give up a staggering 10.0 ypr on punts, while Post is second-worst in that category at 6.0 per opponent return. Consequently, the teams are 13th and 16th, respectively, in average net per punt. Both squads have also had some kicking issues this year as MU's John Banzhof is just 5-for-10 on FGs and 16-for-18 on PATs while Post's Justin Bertone and Jon Korn are combined 2-for-4 on FGs and 16-for-23 on PATs.

What to Expect

The Rock is looking to bounce back from a disappointing loss last week and remain ranked in the top six in the NCAA regional rankings and poised for the NCAA playoff berth heading into next week's game against Cal while Gannon is simply looking for break a four-game losing streak.

Gannon has not put up more than 21 points in its last four games. The biggest cause of that has been its lack of a running game, which hasn't gone for more than 137 yards in the last four games after getting no fewer than 150 yards in its first four contests. There is also a bit of an issue at QB for the Knights, as Bob Bartley has seen more action the last two weeks, splitting time with Zach Boedicker, who started the season as the starter. The Knights need a solid running game, as their passing game is ranked third to last in the league, although Bartley has helped the Knights to their two largest passing totals of the year the last two weeks. Rock's defense is one of the best against the pass, and its 10 INTs are tied for the best in the league and two of Rock's five wins have come this year directly on points scored by the defense.

That may be important because Rock's offense has seen its numbers dwindle over the last three games. Only twice this year has the Rock offense generated over 230 yards of total offense and it has failed to reach 20 points in each of the last three weeks after reached that mark in each of the first four games. QB Rocco Colavecchia has seen his completion percentage go all the way down to 46.3 and he now has more interceptions (7) than TD passes (6). The running game has also been stagnant, not going over 100 yards in four of seven games this year. The Rock will look to break free from these trends against a Gannon defense that has given up at least 200 rushing yards in four of seven games and at least 200 passing yards in three games.

One area that Rock has consistently excelled in this year has been kick returns, as it averages 22.3 ypr on kicks behind Jeff Jackson and 8.4 ypr on punts behind Robert Doiley. The Knights are not as good on kicks at just 18.7 but are solid on punts at 13.5 ypr behind Tyler Batts' 12.5 average. Rock also enjoys an advantage of nearly three yards on net punting average while both kickers in C.J. Bahr of Rock and Jeremy Ditzler of Gannon have combined to miss just four FGs, two each, and one PAT and both also have outstanding range.

What to Expect

IUP is on a four-game losing streak, its longest since 1982 and is trying to avoid a losing season also for the first time since 1982. The Bald Eagles continue to look for their first win of the year and are coming off scoring a season-high in points last week while their passing game has shown some signs of life as of late.

The Crimson Hawks have struggled on offense this year, as QB Andrew Krewatch has missed the last two games with an injury and although backup QB Pat Smith has played fairly solid, having not thrown an interception in 59 attempts, IUP has scored just four offensive touchdowns in the last three games. Although they have one of the best backs in the league in Tobias Robinson, the Hawks statistically are ranked in the lower half of the league in rushing offense as well. Luckily for IUP, it will face a Lock Haven defense that is giving up over 400 ypg in total offense and only once this year has held on opponent to under 300 yards.

IUP's defense has been fairly solid this year but has struggled with the average starting field position it has been being given over the last few games. While its run defense has maintained its stoutness, allowing just over 100 ypg, its pass defense has been attacked recently, giving up over 200 yards in four of the last five games while ranking in the lower half of the PSAC. While its rush defense matches up very well against the Bald Eagles' rush offense that only averages 0.3 ypc, LHU is coming off a season-best 20-of-27 completed passes last week without a pick between Jarret Kratzer and Jarryd Burkett. Although Kratzer has gotten the majority of the snaps this year, Burkett may be poised to receive more. The Eagles had a setback, however, as leading rusher and second-leading receiver Ibrahim Smith may be lost for the season due to injury.

Special teams is how IUP has managed to keep all of its losses close and win at least one of its games this year. The Hawks have three special teams touchdowns in the last two games and four for the year, all kickoff or punt returns by Akwasi Owusu-Ansah, and his 33.2 kick return average and 12.7 punt return average give IUP a clear advantage over Haven's 15.4 ypr average on kicks and 1.8 on punts. The Eagles are yet to make a field goal this year, while IUP K Craig Burgess is 5-for-6 on FGs and a perfect 18-of-18 on PATs.

What to Expect

This contest will likely serve as an "elimination" game with the winner remaining in contention for the PSAC East title, likely one game behind Bloomsburg with both teams having a game remaining against the Huskies, while the loser will likely be out of contention, likely two games behind the Huskies with only two left to play, assuming a Bloomsburg win this week.

The Golden Rams bounced back from a disappointing loss against East Stroudsburg two weeks ago by topping a hot C.W Post team on the road. They did so defensively by limiting Post's top-ranked running game and holding it to well under its average. They will likely need to do the same on defense against the Red Raiders, who boast the second-best running game in the league behind the three-headed attack of Kevin Herod, Kevin Marshall and Roshaan McCain. The Ship pass attack is also potent, ranking in the top five in the league, with WR Mike Harris being the PSAC's leading receiver and TE Mark Rossi being a red zone target with seven TD receptions. Overall, it will be the top-ranked offense, both in terms of points and yards, going up against the league's top-ranked defense in terms of yards allowed.

The Shippensburg defense has been up and down this year, coming up with some outstanding performances, specifically in wins over Edinboro and East Stroudsburg, but also has given up a lot of points at times, specifically in losses to Shepherd and C.W. Post. As a result, Ship ranks around the middle of the league in total defense. It will have its hands full once again as it faces one of the best offenses it will face all year in the Golden Rams, who have quietly averaged just short of 400 ypg. Eight different players have scored rushing TDs as the Rams spread out the rushing attack, while Dan DePalma and Steve Miller are the top threats in the passing game.

Both teams have dynamic kick returns. West Chester boasts Kevin Garland and his 26.9 ypr average on punts. He also averages 20.3 on kicks while DePalma averages 25.7. Ship counters with Harris (12.3 ypr) on punts and Marshall (26.5) and Bryan Barley (26.8) on kicks. The two squad also boast the top two net punting averages in the league.

What to Expect

East Stroudsburg likely needs to win out to maintain its NCAA playoff hopes after dropping out of the ranking after its loss last week while Kutztown is looking to start a run and finish the year strong like it did last year as it comes into this game having lost four of its last five games.

After starting the year out with an outstanding running game behind Zach Krise, East Stroudsburg's running game has fallen down in the league rankings recently as Krise has missed two of the last three games and the Warriors have struggled to mount a consistent running attack. That plays into Kutztown's rush defense, which is one of the best in the league, but it also plays into the Warriors' strong passing game, which is ranked second in the league and will go up against the worst pass defense in the league in the Golden Bears, who have only two interceptions on the year, a league low. It will likely be a heavy dose of Matt Marshall throwing the ball to Jeff Giglio, Ed Kiser and Sam Shuman and others.

Kutztown's passing has gotten a boost in recent weeks as Kevin Morton, who is more of a passing QB, took over the starting job for Shane Martin, who is more of a running threat. The new passing threat, combined with the Golden Bears' potent running game led by Dontay Wilson, has made for a more balanced offense for KU. That could present a problem for East Stroudsburg's defense, which has been inconsistent this year, sometimes faring well against the run but not the pass and sometimes vice versa. One thing that has been consistent is that the Warriors have given up at least 300 yards of total offense in five out of its seven games, and in four out of those five games, it has given up at least 390 yards. Despite this, the Warriors have yielded the fifth-fewest points in the PSAC, as the Warriors' 16 takeaways, including 10 INTs, are second in the league.

Both teams have potential big-play threats in the return game. Both Giglio and Kiser are the Warriors' primary kick returns and they have combined to help ESU to a respectable 21.3 average kick return. Kendell Coleman for Kutztown averages 25.5 ypr on kicks and 9.5 ypr on punts. On punts, the Warriors average only 1.9 ypr. After a tough start to the season, ESU K Drew Reinhard has been solid, going 5-for-8 on FGs and 22-for-25 on PATs while KU's Matt Dineen is 13-for-14 on FGs, and has actually missed more PATs than FGs, going 13-for-15.

What to Expect

Although each team will still have to play two other teams that are still in contention for the PSAC West crown after this game, this battle of West unbeaten teams may decide the West title and its representative in the championship game.

California has only three interceptions on the year, second-fewest in the league, and is only ranked around the middle of the league in pass defense, having given up some big passing numbers to a pair of good passing teams in West Chester and Clarion earlier this year. That past performance would appear to favor Edinboro, which boasts the top passing offense in the league behind QB Trevor Harris' PSAC-leading passing numbers. The Vulcans will need to assert their advantage in rush defense, as they are allowing opponents fewer than 100 ypg on average and have not allowed an individual 100-yard performance. That gives them an advantage over Edinboro's running game, particularly if Junior Jabbie is unable to play due to injury.

Cal QB Josh Portis is perhaps the hottest QB in the league right now, as has not thrown an interception in the last four games and the last 18 quarters while throwing 17 TD passes in that same span. The long pass has been Cal's biggest weapon as of late, as the Vulcans have at least one TD pass from 40 yards or more in each of the last three games. They will face a solid pass defense in Edinboro that has improved as of late, but will likely look to exploit the Fighting Scots' rush defense, which has been suspect for most of the year. The Scots have given up at least one rushing play of 20 or more yards in six out of seven games this year. The Vulcans will likely rotate at least four backs in and out as four backs have at least 30 carries this year. Freddie Bacco has the most carries while Windell Brown has gotten more carries recently after returning from injury.

Both teams are fairly even in the kicking and punting areas but Cal enjoys an advantage on kick returns as the Vulcans average 26.1 ypr as a team, led by Terrence Johnson's 26.5 and Chedrick Cherry's 34.8 averages. Edinboro has the edge on punt returns led by Ben Swank's 30.0 average including one for a TD.

What to Expect

This game appears to be a mismatch on paper as an unbeaten Bloomsburg team goes up against a winless Cheyney team. It will match the top scoring and overall defense against the second-worst scoring offense in the league.

Bloomsburg has one of the top running games in the PSAC as RB Derrick Price has given his team a boost, accumulating over 500 yards and 125 ypg in just four games since his return, elevating the Huskies all the way to third in the league in rushing. They will go up against the league's worst rushing defense, as the Wolves give up over 250 ypg on the ground. The Wolves are decent against the pass, but still give up more through the air than Bloom averages.

Cheyney is coming off its best offensive performance of the year, one in which it scored 36 points and QB Angel Rodriguez accounted for nearly 400 yards of total offense and five TD, four rushing and one passing. Rodriguez and RB Ron Hunter give the Wolves two threats in the backfield and they have helped Cheyney rank in the upper half of the league in rushing offense, a drastic improvement over last year. However, they will be going up against the league's best rush defense in Bloom after going up against one of the worst rush defenses in the league in Millersville last week. The Huskies also have one of the top scoring defenses in the country and are yet to give up more than 14 points in a game.

Bloomsburg kick returner Jesse Cooper missed some time earlier this year due to injury, which paved the way for Brandon Real to get some time returning kicks, which he made the most of, giving the Huskies two big-play threats in the return game now that Cooper is back healthy again. Cooper (24.3 ypr) and Real (23.7 ypr) give the Huskies a clear advantage on kick returns, as Cheyney averages just 17.6 ypr on is yet to return a kick more than 30 yards on the year. On punts, the Wolves have a potential threat in Travis Taltoan, who has a long return of 33 yards this year, but overall the Wolves have returned a league-low three punts on the year, while Bloom averages 11.2 ypr as a team on punts, led by Real's 24.6 average that includes a return for a touchdown. Cheyney has had one of the most improved kicking games in the league as Tyler Wilkinson is 3-for-4 on field goals and 10-for-11 on PATs after the Wolves did not make a single FG last year and made less than half of their PATs. Those good numbers are matched by Jon Koenig's 7-for-9 on FGs and 18-for-18 on PATs. Bloom also enjoys a nearly five-yard advantage in net punting average.
